LORNA LLOYD'S DIARY OF THE WAR

Professor Hazel Hall will outline a recreational project that she carried out anonymously - and for fun - between September 2019 and January 2021. Over this period, the bulk of which coincided with the Covid19 pandemic lockdowns, Hazel posted online diary entries that offer a personal commentary on the events of the early months of the Second World War from September 1939 to January 1941.

The diarist was 25 year-old Lorna Lloyd. Lorna had studied English at Girton College Cambridge and then embarked upon a career as an English teacher. In 1939 she lived in Malvern, Worcestershire with her parents.
